LM:CE- Labour Mobility: Certification Equivalencies from Province to Province

***Quebec does not have a centralized regulatory body for early childhood educators. Instead, certification and hiring decisions are typically made by individual childcare service providers. It's best to refer them to apply to a school in Quebec.

1. Alberta – Level 1 Certification (via BC ECEA)

Step 1: Review Guide

Read the <u>Child Care Staff Certification Guide</u>, especially page 7 on labour mobility.

Step 2: Prepare Documents

- BC ECEA certificate
- Official transcripts or training certificates
- Work or study permit (if applicable)
- Proof of name change (if needed)

Step 3: Apply Online

Go to <u>applychildcarecertification.alberta.ca</u>, create an account, complete the application, and upload all documents.

Step 4: Wait for Processing

Processing takes about 4–6 weeks. Incomplete applications may be delayed.

2. Saskatchewan – Out-of-Province Certification

Equivalent: BC ECEA is recognized in Saskatchewan.

Steps:

- 1. Download Application Form:
 - Access the "Application for Certification Out of Province" form: Download Form (PDF)
- 2. Prepare Documents:
 - Clear copy of government-issued photo ID
 - Official transcripts sent directly from your educational institution
 - o Copy of your BC ECEA certificate
- 3. Submit Application:

- 4. Processing Time: Approximately 4–6 weeks.

4. Nova Scotia - Level 1 Classification

Equivalent: BC ECEA is recognized as Level 1 in Nova Scotia.

Steps:

5. Prince Edward Island (PEI) – Early Childhood Intern

Equivalent: BC ECEA is recognized as Early Childhood Intern in PEI.

Steps:

1. Download Application Form:

2. Prepare Documents:

- Proof of PEI residency (to obtain full certification; otherwise, a letter of standing is provided)
- Copy of your BC ECEA certificate
- Criminal Background Check and Vulnerable Sector Search conducted within the last six months
- Official transcripts sent directly from your educational institution
- Proof of identity
- Proof of eligibility to work in Canada

6. Newfoundland and Labrador – ECE Intern

Equivalent: BC ECEA is generally recognized as equivalent to an ECE Intern.

 - Copy of BC ECEA certificate
 - Government-issued ID
 - Official transcripts sent directly from the institution
 - Any name change documentation (if needed)
